The Road to a Successful Outcome



Appoint someone responsible for planning

- Produces regular programmes
- Keeps version control
- Keeps scope control
- Weekly report, what milestones were hit last week, what ones were missed, what should be hit this week, effect on planned completion date
- Identify who is responsible for each delay event





Appoint someone to be responsible for managing risk

- Follow the rules for raising risks
- Identify residual risks
- Decide when a risk is closed
- Identify actions to mitigate a particular risk
- Report on actions cleared, actions missed and actions for next week





Appoint somebody to be responsible for financial management

- There will probably be an overspend
- Ensure proper financial governance is in place
- Audit value for money
- Fully understand the finances and cashflow





Appoint somebody to be responsible for commercial management

- Maintain a single version of the truth
- Fully understand the commercial machinery of the contract
- Appreciate the tension between commercial management and relationship management
- Be aware of the potential consequences if you starve your subcontractors of cash (suspension, disputes, wrong behaviours)





Your team deserve to be supported

Supported by both directors and colleagues

When things go wrong:

- Frequently it is caused by confusion or inadequacies in processes, systems or procedures
- Less frequently, it is because of a training need
- Rarely it is because of a wrong appointment unless that appointment was the cheapest available
- Encouragement through support requires:
 - a no-blame culture
 - a continuous improvement culture
 - passion within the company





Cut the confusion

- Where there is confusion, most people will fall back on doing what they feel comfortable doing which may not be the best thing in the circumstances
- Make sure that all members of the team truly understand their responsibilities and who they are accountable to
- Don't assume everyone automatically understands all the requirements
